Providing Funding through the Emergency Food and Shelter Program & American Rescue Plan Act

The United Way of Portage County Emergency Food and Shelter Program has received a grant of \$67,940 from the EFSP National Board Program, a federal program administered by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency.

The Portage County Emergency Food and Shelter Board is composed of local representatives of the national organizations as well as Portage County government, local housing authority, emergency management agency, and non-profit organizations serving low-income households. **The local board is accountable to the national board for the use and awarding of the funds.**

Funds will be made available for housing, utility, and food assistance programs.

The local EFSP Board awarded:
Community Action Council - \$13,588 for utilities
Family & Community Services (HESS) - \$27,176 for housing
Change Hunger - \$27,176 for food

Coleman Adult Day Services

Coleman Adult Day Services provide a medical model of daytime care for adults with dementia and Alzheimer's in a safe, supportive, and socially stimulating setting, including daytime care for a small number of adults with developmental disabilities. Haymaker Farmers' Market

"Power of Produce" kids club, a weekly program teaching healthy eating habits at Market to kids 12 & under, returned in Spring 2023. Kids can try samples of produce from the Market, do fun activities, and receive \$2

of tokens for the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables at Market! Last year Haymaker Farmers' Market increased access to healthy, fresh, local foods--our food assistance programming increased by 50% to over \$90,000 of local foods distributed to people who need it (including but not limited to, WIC Perks program and the Produce Perks Midwest "Fruit and Vegetable Coupon" program for TANF eligible families). Haymaker administers these food benefit programs so more local farmers and food businesses can participate – strengthening the local economy and keeping food dollars in our communities. 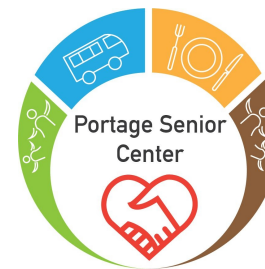
Girls on The Run

GOTR is a confidence-building program for girls in 3rd through 8th grade, inspiring all girls to build their confidence, kindness and decision-making skills while building a sense of connection in a team setting. On average, Girls on the Run serves 1500 girls annually. At the core of their mission Girls on the Run Northeast Ohio serves as one of the preeminent organizations designed to enhance girls' social, emotional and physical skills and behaviors to successfully navigate life experiences. With the addition of more sites delivering the program, there will be even more opportunities

to participate. The Portage County Senior Center processed and delivered 750 packets of Farmers Market coupons to our senior citizens in Portage County. AmeriCorps Seniors civically engages individuals 55 and better in meaningful and purposeful volunteer opportunities that keep them physically, mentally, and socially engaged which leads to improved health outcomes and an independent, quality life. The stipend programs provide a modest stipend, meal allowance, and mileage reimbursement to enable

Hope Town promotes long-term recovery, self-initiative, and increased independence by providing residents with access to the resources they need to make lifestyle changes. Hope Town Recovery Housing aims to remove common barriers to successful recovery by providing affordable housing in conjunction with other services to help residents and the recovery community at large sustain quality of life improvements. Hope Town has opened a 15-bed female

recovery house in Windham to go along with the 20-bed male house. They also run Hope Town on Wheels, a transportation service to provide rides to medical appointments, treatment and recovery meetings!
