## The Giving Well Family Foundation Donates to Hope on Wheels



<u>The Giving Well Family Foundation</u>, administered by UWPC recently donated \$5,000 to Hope Town Recovery Housing for their Hope on Wheels program.

<u>Hope Town</u> serves their mission and vision through housing, transportation and employment for men and women in recovery.

The Giving Well Family Foundation grant made it possible for Hope on Wheels to purchase a vehicle to provide 25 rides a week to those with Medicaid, so that they are able to attend medical and treatment appointments. In the 3 ½ months since the grant award <u>Hope on Wheels</u> was able to provide over 300 additional rides with this vehicle.



### Reading Role Models Foster Early Literacy Skills at Local Elementary Schools

With the 2022-23 school year well underway, our Reading Role Model program has been very active. So far this fall we have visited Brimfield, Rootstown, Suffield, West Park (Ravenna), Walls (Kent), Streetsboro and Windham elementary schools.

## **Hope Town Recovery Housing**

Hope Town promotes long-term recovery, self-initiative, and increased independence by providing residents with access to the resources they need to make lifestyle changes. Hope Town Recovery Housing addresses the four primary needs for people with addiction in our community: supportive housing, employment, transportation and recovery support.



Hope Town recently opened a 15-bed female recovery house in Windham. They also purchased two vehicles and started a transportation service for those on Medicaid to drive them to their treatment, doctor visits, dentists, pharmacies and more! The 20-bed male house has served more than 40 men since June 2021. Many of the residents are getting jobs and successfully graduating treatment. Read more at their website.

### **Rural Relief Mobile Food Pantry**

Rural Relief Mobile Food Pantry's mission is to address food insecurity in rural Portage County by providing a mobile food pantry to under-served communities. The organization has been focusing on fresh produce and meat this year, trying to limit the amount of boxed and canned items. They provide each child they serve with a snack bag and, when possible,

they provide basic hygiene items for each family served. They continue to explore ways to provide more balanced and nutritious food to the communities they visit. Food insecurity in rural communities is increasing. The pantry is seeking more donors to help fight hunger in underserved rural communities. <u>Visit their website for more information</u>.

### Townhall II

Townhall II provides comprehensive substance use disorder counseling, treatment, and Medication Assisted Treatment. The



organization also has a 24-hour Helpline at 330-678-HELP and a continuum of victim services (advocacy and counseling). Townhall II can also coordinate referrals to detox facilities for anyone living in Portage County. With the help of the United Way, Townhall II is able to provide free on-site childcare for newborns to age 4 for current counseling clients. For more information, visit their website.



### Habitat for Humanity of Portage County

Habitat for Humanity is putting God's love into action by building homes, communities and hope. Habitat is in the process of completing its 71st project and

has has broken ground on its 72nd for the Powe Family. They have also begun their Neighborhood Revitalization project, thus serving those in need of home repairs in Portage County, including a senior citizen and veteran who was no longer able to lift his leg to get into his tub. Habitat replaced it with a walk-in shower with grab bars, seating and a hand-held shower head. The repairs were part of the agency's Aging In Place program, which is a component of Neighborhood Revitalization — focusing on older adult homeowners. The goal is to help those who are over 60 in Portage County make the repairs and modifications necessary to help them "grow old" in their homes with comfort and dignity. **Contact Kaleena Gharky for more information at <u>kaleena@habitatofportage.org</u> or visit their website.** 

### **Kidney Foundation of Ohio**

The Kidney Foundation of Ohio provides direct financial assistance to patients suffering from renal (kidney) disease that enables them to receive their lifesaving medications and treatments. In 2021, the Foundation served more than 1,000 patients. The



Foundation provides funding for vital medications, nutritional supplements and reimbursement for transportation expenses to life-saving dialysis and transplant appointments for kidney patients, who would otherwise have difficulty affording them. Since summer, the Foundation has been able to provide 10 people with mileage reimbursement, and 20 with PARTA passes, to get to and from dialysis appointments, and nine people with assistance to pay for their medications and nutritional supplements. These funds are helping people with kidney disease live a better quality of life! Also, the Foundation recently launched a three-part video series, Roadmap for Kidney Transplantation. This series was created with the goal to educate kidney patients on the benefits associated with getting listed for a kidney transplant, and to answer questions about the process. The videos are available to watch on the Foundation's <u>YouTube</u> channel.



## **Coleman Health Services**

In 2021, Coleman was designated a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) in several counties and in 2022 the

organization was awarded, either in full or in part, three catchments of the state-wide OhioRISE (Resilience through Integrated Systems and Excellence) program. As a CCBHC, Coleman will have primary health care offered at appointed locations and as part of OhioRISE, the organization is at the forefront of Medicaid's new specialized managed care program for youth with complex behavioral health and multi-system needs. Lastly, in 2022 Coleman was awarded more than \$1 million to serve at the forefront of the 988 National Suicide Prevention Lifeline and will field calls from that line in multiple locations statewide. In the last fiscal year, Coleman placed 189 men and women in homes in Portage County. In addition, the organization helped 122 Portage residents find job placements. Coleman Adult Day Services in Ravenna provided comprehensive services to 140 Portage residents and their families. Overall, Coleman served 7,070 Portage residents across all service lines and the organization is poised and ready to serve even more this coming year. ## **Children's Advocacy Center**

The non-profit <u>Children's Advocacy Center (CAC)</u>, located in donated space at University Hospitals Portage Medical Center in Ravenna, offers FREE training & prevention services to the community and FREE holistic services for the entire family navigating the devastation of child abuse, including: ongoing support, education, advocacy, medical services, court support, and more! The center has expanded services to include child



physical abuse, more human trafficking services including free trainings, and free training regarding mandated reporting, child abuse, and positive parenting!

## **Big Brothers, Big Sisters**

Big Brothers, Big Sisters provides children facing adversity with strong and enduring, one-on-one mentoring relationships. The program is looking for volunteers to join the community-based mentoring program. Volunteers must be able to spend 12 hours per month, for at least



one year, with their match. Volunteers spend quality one-on-one time with their match, participating in activities such as taking a walk in the park, listening to music, going to a football game, playing board games or going to a museum. GOTR is a confidence-building program for girls in third through eighth grade. The program has been adapted to ensure the health and safety of volunteers and program participants. At the core of the group's mission, Girls on the Run Northeast Ohio serves as one of the preeminent organizations designed to enhance girls' social, emotional and physical skills and behaviors to successfully navigate life experiences. The program's intentional curriculum places an emphasis on developing competence, confidence, connection, character, caring

and contribution in young girls through lessons that incorporate running and other physical activities.
